 - d. Kathy may submit a Hoffman grant at the end of the year to supplement the money we have left for next year.

 - a. Approximately 35 people have not picked up their vouchers yet. Bridget has offered to distribute some at FunFest this weekend.
 - b. Bridget asked community leaders if they were interested in coming to meetings. A couple expressed some interest but the time was not good for them.
