- 5) Fruit and Vegetable Bucks
 - a. Survey and double dollars ACFMA market information was stuffed into envelopes for mailing to 2200 participants.
 - b. \$22,000 in grant money has been used
 - c. With 100% discount, 600% increase in usage
 - d. The incentive is over at the end of May
 - e. Approximately \$10,000 will remain for next year. Need to think about raising \$15,000.
Note: Give WIC 3-6 months' notice (by August) about next year. Due to cycle of how they see participants, they may only see a client 2-4 times a year.
