 - a. Update from meeting with Kennie's:
 - i. Not our priority to make sure customers are still on SNAP
 - ii. When they sign up customers will sign a SNAP Self-Declaration saying they receive SNAP
 - iii. If for some reason the person comes off SNAP, they will need to remove themselves from the program.
 - iv. Incentives will be provided daily, not weekly.
 - v. Customers will get 50% off the top 5 highest priced items.
 - vi. Customers can sign up at the Gettysburg or Biglerville Kennie's Service Desk, SCCAP Food Pantry or during in-store sign up times.

Research in the Kitchen - Ken Albala

Ken Albala, food historian, discusses the importance of cooking and tasting recipes from the past to understand not only the labor involved, the esthetic preferences of people many centuries ago, but also to explore a fascinating culinary landscape largely unknown today.
